

RIDGE HOUSE SEEKS CLINICIANS

Ridge House, located in Reno, is a non-profit treatment agency serving clients with substance use and/or mental health concerns with a focus on prison re-entry needs. With residential and outpatient treatment options available, Ridge House provides tools for ex-offenders, veterans, those recovering from opioid and other substance use issues, and other adults with behavioral health needs to achieve and sustain a healthy, happy life.

We are currently hiring counselor/therapists to work at one of our prison re-entry homes (up to 9 clients) and carry a small outpatient caseload.

Job Requirements:

- Minimum of a Master's Degree in Counseling, Marriage and Family Therapy, Social Work, or closely related field strongly preferred
- Fully Licensed or Licensed Intern as a Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC), Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT) and/or Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CADC), or Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor (LADC), Certified Problem Gambling Counselor (CPGC) OR the ability to become licensed as an intern in any of the above disciplines
- Two years of experience – or an educational equivalent – in substance abuse treatment field
- Experience in both individual and group counseling
- Knowledge of community support groups, such as AA/NA, and the criminal justice system, such as clients on parole/probation

This position is for you if you're:

- Able to communicate effectively and can work as a team member
- Self-motivated and able to set professional goals for oneself and the program
- Appropriately assertive when addressing negative attitudes and behaviors
- Can work full-time with 25 clinical hours weekly

Responsibilities:

- Interview clients and assess their treatment needs
- Perform client intakes in accordance to policies and procedures
- Develop and implement individualized treatment plan with clients
- Meet with each client on caseload for individual counseling sessions based on established client needs
- Facilitate weekly group counseling sessions
- Maintain communication with Department of Parole and Probation, judges, specialty courts and all other referral partners
- Work within the scope of license(s) and best practices
- Develop and implement an appropriate aftercare plan for each client individualized to their needs

- Report to the Clinical Director
- Consult with the Clinical Director regarding client issues and appropriate plan of action to be taken
- Maintain frequent communication with Clinical Director and other members of a client's treatment team, ensuring a holistic approach to treatment
- Attend necessary trainings, keeping abreast of treatment techniques and maintaining certification requirements
- Complete all required reports and documentation within established timeframes
- Other duties as assigned
