The Nevada State Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug, and Gambling Counselors will hold a public hearing at 9:30 a.m., on February 11, 2022. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulations that pertain to chapter 641C of the Nevada Administrative Code (LCB File No. R046-21).

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. This regulation is needed to authorize electronic supervision of interns and to authorize an intern to request an extension of time to complete his or her education and supervision requirements for full licensure.
2. This regulation is not a temporary regulation.
3. This is a permanent regulation and a copy of the regulation may be obtained by contacting Agata Gawronski at agawronski@adgc.nv.gov or (775) 689-0563.

4. Estimated economic effects on businesses:

Adverse effects: There are no adverse effects of this regulation on the businesses it regulates nor on the public.

Beneficial effects: This will allow supervisors to electronically supervise their interns and provide more flexibility in a time of the pandemic. It will also allow an intern to request an extension of time for obtaining the requisite education and supervision for full licensure.

Immediate effects: This will enable electronic supervision of interns and individuals to request extensions of time to complete certain requirements.

Long-term effects: Supervisors and interns will have more flexibility for supervision and individuals who have experienced hardships in obtaining the education or supervision requirements may request an extension of time to complete those requirements.

5. The Executive Director of the Board contacted interested parties and discussed the regulation with them to determine the economic impact. Board staff reviewed the regulation with its legal counsel to determine the economic impact to small businesses.
6. There is no cost to the Board for implementing this regulation.
7. The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any regulation of other state or local governmental entities. The regulations, even after these proposed regulation changes are adopted, will not overlap and duplicate parts of a federal regulation. The Board is not aware of any proposed provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity.
8. This regulation is not required pursuant to a federal law.
9. This regulation does not contain any provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity.
10. This regulation does not establish a new fee.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Board may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to Agata Gawronski at agawronski@adgc.nv.gov or (775) 689-0563. Written submissions must be received by the Board on or before February 10, 2022. If no person who is directly affected by

the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Board may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

A copy of this notice and the regulation (LCB File No R046-21) to be adopted will be on file at the State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours.
